Minutes of the first meeting of the re-constituted Struan Community Council, held in Struan Primary School on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> January 2020 at 7.00pm

# Item 2: Adoption of the Constitution and Standing Orders

## **Item 5: Any other Competent Business**

Mr MacKinnon enquired if at present there are any issues that require input from Highland Council, Mr MacKinnon was advised that there are 3 issues that they would like him to look into to see if assistance can be given, as follows;

<u>Road Signs</u> – Signs in and around the village are in extremely poor condition, in addition, at least 70% of the Passing Place signs on the Hill Road are either damaged or non-existent.

<u>Roads</u> – As is common in every area of Skye the roads are in an atrocious condition, in particular, the single-track roads that come off the main road through the district.

<u>Speeding</u> – Community complaints regards the speed of vehicles through the village, has been raised with local Police, can Highland Council assist.

Mr MacKinnon confirmed he would look into all & revert when he has any information.
