### Structure, Governance and Management

Struan Community Development Group was registered in its current legal form 13th June 2019. The organisation was previously an unincorporated association but changed its legal form. The assets of the unincorporated association were transferred to the SCIO on 13th June 2019. The organisation consists of i) members who have the right to attend members' meetings, appoint board members and take decisions on constitution changes, and ii) board members (charity trustees) who generally control the activities of the organisation and monitor and control the financial position of the organisation.

### Constitution

The Charity was set up on 13th June 2019 and is bound by its Constitution which was agreed and adopted in May 2019.

## **Appointment of trustees**

At each AGM, the members may elect any member to be a charity trustee. The board may appoint any member to be a charity trustee. At each AGM, all the charity trustees shall retire from office but shall then be eligible for re-election. The maximum number of charity trustees is 7 and the minimum is 5.

### **Objectives and Activities**

The organisation's main purpose is to advance citizenship and community development through the initiation and support of projects which result in the development of sustainable buildings, infrastructure and facilities within the Struan area for the benefit of all members of the local community.

In addition to this we aim to contribute to the advancement of the arts, culture and in particular the heritage of area by developing and maintaining facilities, including those which provide access to and interpretation of the archaeological heritage of the area, so that these can be enjoyed by all members of the public.

#### **Activities**

The group's principal activity since it was established as an unincorporated body in January 2018 has been to establish the feasibility of building a combined Community & Visitor Centre adjacent to the Dun Beag broch in Struan. During 2018 and early 2019 funding applications for Stage 1 funding for Dun Beag @ Struan project were successfully made to The Highland Council, The Scottish Land Fund and Struan Community Trust. These activities were then carried out between Spring 2019 and February 2020, culminating in a Community Open Day and Meeting in February.

### **Achievements and Performance**

Significant funding has been secured to cover the costs of topographical, archaeological and ground condition survey work on the chosen site. In addition to this we commissioned a valuation of the land, pre-sale legal work, a feasibility study, conceptual design and other specialist consultancy to support the business planning process. Additional funds were obtained in early 2020 when it became apparent that following establishment of the ground conditions, specialist peat consultancy was also required.

The survey work was carried out between May and July 2019 and work on the design and feasibility commenced in June. The chosen contractors worked closely in association with both the Board of Trustees and a Steering Group made up from Members of the Group.

The final feasibility Study Report was made available in February 2020 and presented to the community at an Open Day/Evening Meeting at which members were invited to express their preferences for the way forward via a ballot. The results of the this indicated a continuing 85% in support of progressing with the project.

Sadly by 16th March it was clear that the COVID-19 Pandemic was going to have a profound effect on the progress of the project, not least because the production of a sustainable business plan was dependent upon a similarly sustainable tourism industry existing. The Trustees therefore agreed to suspend the project indefinitely although some background work has continued in support of the business planning process. We hope to be able to take this forward at some point in the future when projected visitor numbers are more secure again.

The Group also continues to support environmental activities within the community, in the form of beach cleaning and tree planting and will continue to do so whenever this is feasible.

### **Financial review**

Total income for the period was £24,155. Expenditure for same period was £21,058 resulting in a surplus of £3,097. Reserves held at year end were £96 of unrestricted funds and £3,001 of restricted funds.

### **Reserves Policy**

There is no requirement in the constitution for reserves however the charity maintains a Reserves Policy which states that a minimum of £350 should be retained at all times, primarily to ensure that the Group can continue to operate (currently meeting online) and meet its statutory reporting requirements.

### Plans for future period

In addition to the current principal project - the Dun Beag @ Struan Community & Visitor Centre project - the Group is currently planning to organise a Community Excavation on a newly discovered prehistoric roundhouse site in late 2021 and we are currently drawing up funding applications to support this.

We are also liaising with the Skye Cycle Network project to investigate the possibility of improving access paths within the community, for the benefit of both residents and visitors.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees on the unaudited accounts of Struan Community Development Group.

Notes to the accounts

### 1 Basis of Accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the Receipts and Payments basis in accordance with the Charities & Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

This is the first set of accounts prepared by the SCIO since its inception and therefore there are no comparatives.

### 2 Nature and purpose of funds

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. The trustees maintain a single unrestricted fund for the day-to-day running of the Charity. During the year the charity received donations totalling £131 from Struan Community Development Group unincorporated association.

Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes. Grants totalling £24,024 were received - £9,624 from the Scottish Land Fund and £14,400 from Struan Community Development Group unincorporated association which was made up of two separate grants - £13,900 from Struan Community Trust and £500 from Highland Council. All grant funding to be used to cover the cost of Stage 1 work packages for the Dùn Beag @ Struan Visitor & Community Centre Project.
